Dear 8th Grade Parents:

As in the past, participation in all end-of-the-year activities, (dances, picnics, field trips, etc.) is dependent upon appropriate behavior at all times. We want our student body to be aware of the possible consequences of improper behavior and to offer those students who are having some difficulties, an opportunity to correct their behavior before it's too late.

Beginning on Monday, March 8th, any student who accumulates more than eight (8) points, will not be permitted to attend **any** end-of-the-year grade level functions.

10 Points	Out-of-school suspension
5 Points	In-school suspension (full day)
3 Points	Detention, for any reason (unexcused lateness to school, excessive lateness to class, misbehavior, etc.)
3 Points	Lunch detention, one period, Responsibility Room

We have discussed these guidelines and the reasons for them with the students. They will be strictly enforced and we ask for your support. We know it is difficult if it is your child who is unable to participate. However, if we ask students at this age to be accountable for their behavior, it will help them grow into responsible adults.
