The Island Trees chapter establishes rules for membership that are based upon a student's outstanding performance in the areas of scholarship, service, leadership, and character. These rules directly reflect the national organization's membership criteria. These criteria for selection form the foundation upon which the organization and its activities are built. As a member of the NHS, one must maintain the standards met when selected. In addition, each member must complete a total of 15 (fifteen) community service hours per academic year.

When a member has either fallen below the standards by which the member was selected, violated school rules or the law, or has failed to meet one or more of the established obligations of membership, it may be necessary to review members standing. The advisor reserves the right to review a member's standing in accordance with the national guidelines. Results from such forms of review may include, but are not limited to, increased hours of community service, probation or dismissal from the NHS.
