Mr. Parla opened the meeting by praising one of our students, Kevin Covais, for being one of 24 final contestants on American Idol. Kevin has a great voice and Mr. Parla asked everyone to root for him and vote for him. **RECOGNITION** 

Mr. Parla announced that two students per art teacher in the K-12 art program at Island Trees were selected to exhibit their artwork at the Art Supervisors Association All County Art Exhibit on Saturday, March 18, at the Tilles Center at C.W. Post College.

Mr. Parla announced that the girls basketball team defeated Division Ave. High School on Friday, February 10. They won the conference and will go to the playoffs.

Mr. Parla informed everyone that the Board of Education

has engaged the services of an engineering firm, J.R. Holzmacher, for the lead abatement project at the high school. This firm and the district have been working with the Nassau County Dept. of Health, the State Education Dept., the New York State Dept. of Environmental Conservation, and the New York State Dept. of Health to come up with a plan for the removal of lead from the former rifle range at the high school. Mr. Parla assured everyone that this area is not accessible to students. The work plan has been finalized. There will be a fact sheet prepared by the DEC along with a letter from Mr. Parla that will be mailed to every resident in the district informing them of what the district is doing. The date will be set for an agreement to do the work. There will be a hearing and signs will be posted by the DEC and notices will be publicized in the local newspaper informing the community when the project will begin. The abatement will be done in the summer while no students are in the building. The high school will be empty for two weeks and employees will be relocated to other buildings until the work is completed. Mr. Parla will make more information available as he receives it.

Mr. Parla followed up with the Nutrition Committee. He met with representatives from Stony Brook University on Friday, February 10, to discuss partnering with them. They discussed the kinds of health and wellness issues that take place in the district. They have agreed to do a presentation for us and have agreed to include us as a partner. Mr. Parla asked them to select the dates when they would come in, and he will send a letter to the Nutrition Committee, physical education and health teachers, and school nurses inviting them to the presentation. Stony Brook will discuss what they will provide and the support services, and they will help us in addressing some of the health and wellness issues we are facing. They will look at our food services program to help us modify it. We have to have a Wellness policy in place by July 1. Stony Brook will help us write this policy. They come out of the School of Medicine at Stony Brook.

WHEREAS the Retirement Incentive will offer the retirees \$10,000 if ten (10) teachers tender their resignations, \$15,000 if fifteen (15) tender their resignations, and \$20,000 if thirty-one (31) or more teachers tender their resignations for the purpose of retirement, and

WHEREAS the Retirement Incentive is offered only to full-time teachers and staff who are members of the Island Trees U.T.I.T. who have worked in the Island Trees School District for at least ten years and are eligible by age and service to retire on June 30, 2006.

RESOLVED, That the Board of Education approves the Retirement Incentive offer of \$10,000 if ten (10) teachers retire, \$15,000 if fifteen (15) teachers retire, and \$20,000 if thirty-one (31) or more teachers tender their resignations for the purpose of retirement, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Retirement Incentive is only available to full-time teachers and staff who are members of the Island Trees U.T.I.T. who have worked in the Island Trees School District for at least ten years and are eligible by age and service to retire on June 30, 2006.
